HURRICANE TERMS TO KNOW

Tropical Wave (TW) - A vast area of relatively low air pressure, which moves from east to west across the tropics, causing areas of cloudiness and thunderstorms

Tropical Disturbance (TD) - A cluster of clouds and thunderstorms in the tropics without a defined circulation, moving from east to west.

Tropical Storm (TS) - A rotating system of strong thunderstorms with top sustained winds of 39 to 73 miles per hour.

Tropical storms are dangerous by themselves, and can quickly develop into hurricanes. Storms are named when they reach this stage.

Hurricane (HR)- A tropical cyclone with pronounced counter-clockwise rotation, low pressure center and sustained wind speeds of 74 miles per hour.

HURRICANE ALERTS

Alert (Preliminary) - Hurricane conditions are possible within 72 hours.

Hurricane Watch (Red I) - Hurricane conditions are possible within 36 hours.

Hurricane Warning (Red II) - Hurricane conditions are expected within 24 hours.

All Clear - The threat of the hurricane has passed the country. (This does not mean you are authorized to leave a shelter)



WHAT IS NEMO?

The National Emergency Management Organization is the primary Government of Belize Department responsible for disaster mitigation, public preparedness, response, recovery and reconstruction in Belize

The NEMO Department is the full-time agency responsible for the training of responding agencies and fosters coordination across the public and private sector during noncrises periods.

The Department is also mandated to keep Belize in a state of preparedness for any emergency that may require a national response.

MISSION STATEMENT

The National Emergency Management Organization, in cooperation with the respective emergency management committees, and all public and private agencies, is established to preserve life and property in the event of an emergency, threatened or real, and to mitigate the impact on the country and it's people.

EMERGENCY OPERATIONS CENTERS (EOC)

Emergency Operations Centers are facilities that are established to serve as 24 hour coordination centers. They are staffed by trained individuals who are capable of managing various aspects of an emergency including response and relief operations.

VISION

A professional department empowered by public and political buy-in will contribute to sustainable development and quality of life by significantly reducing vulnerabilities for at risk communities through enhanced Comprehensive Disaster Management (CDM)



LEVELS OF RESPONSE

- 1. The National Level (NEMO is fully activated)
- 2. The District Level (NEMO is partially activated)
- 3. The Village Level (NEMO is locally activated)

DISTRICT COMMITTEES

The country of Belize has been divided into Emergency Management Zones that includes the six districts and three (3) special zones as indicated below:
