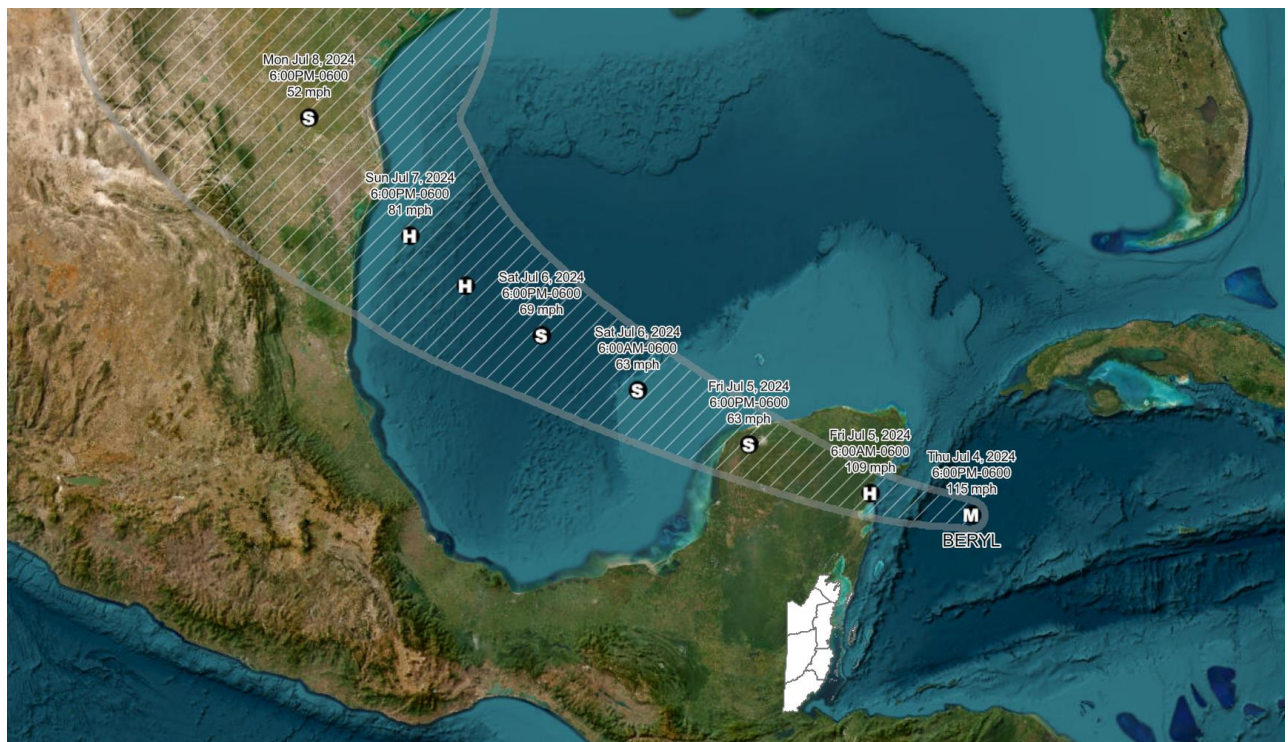
ADVISORY NO. 7

HURRICANE BERYL

As of 9:00 PM, Thursday, 4TH JULY, 2024

The National Meteorological Service of Belize and the National Emergency Management Organization (NEMO) hereby inform the general public that at 9:00pm tonight, a Tropical Storm WATCH remains in effect from Belize city northward. Hurricane Beryl strengthened to a (Cat 3) and was centered near 19.6N / 85.5W or about 135 miles east-southeast of Tulum Mexico. Beryl was moving to the west at 16 mph with maximum sustained winds of 115 mph. The National Meteorological Service continues to closely monitor the progress of Hurricane Beryl.

Tropical Storm conditions with sustained wind speeds of 39-73mph, are possible over the watch area from Belize City to Corozal within the next 24-36 hours. The public is advised to remain vigilant, continue to monitor the weather situation, and listen to official bulletins issued by the NMS and NEMO. Excessive rainfall is possible over the country, especially the north and coast during the next 24 to 48 hours. Residents should continue monitoring the weather situation and contact the Hydrology Unit at 822-0667 for any information on flooding or NEMO for advisories. Operators of small crafts should remain in safe harbor due to Tropical Storm conditions with strong gusty winds and rough seas.



Based on the latest advisory, Hon. John Briceño, Prime Minister of Belize, and the Chairman of NEMO announces that if conditions remain the same, businesses in the Districts of Corozal, Orange Walk and Belize and the Islands of San Pedro and Caye Caulker should reopen as per normal tomorrow morning.

NEMO reminds everyone that it is still hurricane season, and staying safe should remain a top priority. Ensure your emergency plans are up to date, stock up on essential supplies, and stay informed about weather updates from reliable sources. Let's work together to keep our community safe and prepared.
